Colonel Randal D. Fullhart is commandant, Air Command and Staff College, Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala. As commandant, he leads the joint military college responsible for educating mid-career officers and civilians in developing, employing, commanding and supporting air and space power across the spectrum of joint and combined operations.

Colonel Fullhart, a graduate of the United States Air Force Academy, has served in a variety of assignments including command at the squadron, group and wing level. He has commanded two expeditionary flying squadrons, an expeditionary Operations Group in Operation Allied Force, and an expeditionary Wing in Operation Iraqi Freedom. Colonel Fullhart has also held staff assignments that include experience in operations, safety, acquisition and government affairs at the major command and Headquarters Air Force levels, overseas assignments, including U.S. Air Forces in Europe headquarters, and joint experience at U.S. Transportation Command. Colonel Fullhart is a command pilot with more than 3,500 flying hours in the C-141, KC-135, T-38 and T-37.
