**AFI 34-219, 9 September 1998, is supplemented as follows. A star (é) indicates since previous edition:**

1.1.2. Consistent with Alabama state law, the minimum age for selling, serving, buying, possessing, or consuming alcoholic beverages at Maxwell AFB and Gunter Annex is 21 years.

é 1.4.1. In addition to beverage supervisors and servers, the training program applies to bartenders, bar backs, and food and beverage service staff.

é 1.5.1.8. Regular coupons may be used in the lounges, but must not specially target alcoholic beverages.

é 1.5.2.2.9. (AETC) Encourages patrons to select a designated driver and identify patron-selected designated drivers with pins, shirts, jackets, etc. Designated drivers may consume free nonalcoholic beverages (determined by the club manager) during the period of time they are designated drivers. To encourage the use of designated driver program, managers should consider an incentive program whereby a unit with an exceptional program could receive recognition.

é 1.9. In addition, do not display charts, graphs, or pictorials that compare body size and weight to the volume of alcohol consumed.

2.1.6.3.4. (Added) (MAFB) Gunter Shoppette (Gunter Annex)

3.2. Officers' and Collocated Clubs are authorized to sell beer, wine, and wine coolers with less than seven percent alcoholic content by volume for off-premise consumption when AAFES operated retail outlets are closed. Sales are restricted to six-pack containers. Contracted parties are exempt from this restriction.

3.2.3. Alabama state law (28-1-3.1 Ala Code 1975) allows untaxed alcoholic beverages to be transported off base under the following conditions:

3.2.3.1. (Added) (MAFB) Individuals have proof that beverages were purchased from a military outlet.

3.2.3.2. (Added) (MAFB) Beverages are not stored or possessed in the passenger area of the vehicle or in the view of any passenger.

3.2.3.3. (Added) (MAFB) Off-base transportation/possession limits, as authorized by Alabama state law, must be prominently displayed in all AAFES locations selling packaged alcoholic beverages.

3.5. To protect the privileges of all AAFES and Services customers, and to assure that the Air Force is doing its part in reducing illegal marketing practices of alcoholic beverages, the following on-base possession/transportation limits are in effect at all alcoholic sales outlets:

3.5.1. (Added) (MAFB) Authorized customers purchasing three to ten cases of beer in one day must sign a control log.

3.5.2. (Added) (MAFB) Authorized customers who purchase one to three cases of spirits or wine in one day must sign a control log. This applies only if the case is of like beverages.

3.5.3. (Added) (MAFB) Authorized customers who desire to purchase more than three cases of spirits or wine in one day must obtain a letter of authorization from 42 SPTG/SV.
