

Maxwell AFB – Gunter Annex Frequently Asked Questions regarding PreK – 12 Education

1. When does school start?

In Alabama, the school year typically starts at the beginning of August and ends late May.

2. How old must a child be to start school?

The compulsory school age in Alabama is 6 to 17, but a child who turns five years old by 1 September can start kindergarten in a public school. Private schools can and do enroll younger students.

3. What schools do children/youth living on Maxwell AFB-Gunter Annex attend?

<u>Note</u>: FamCamp on Maxwell AFB is also designated as permanent living quarters. This designation allows permanent residents within the camping area to attend Maxwell Elementary & Middle School.

Students living on base can opt to attend MPS Magnet schools (if accepted), private, or charter schools.

High School:

Students residing in housing on Maxwell AFB and Gunter-Annex in grades 9-12 are zoned in the Montgomery Public School System. Maxwell AFB is zoned for Carver Senior High School and Gunter-Annex is zoned for Percy Julian High School. Bus service is provided for these MPS schools.

4. What school do children/youth <u>living off</u> base attend?

There are four school districts surrounding Maxwell-Gunter AFB where families may choose to live. All public school districts are accredited by <u>Cognia</u>.

- Autauga County Schools

- Montgomery Public Schools
- Pike Road Schools

Through the 2021 National Defense Authorization Act Congress allows for the children of full-time, active-duty who do not live on an installation to attend a DoDEA school, provided space is available. Click here for more information about the DoDEA pilot program.

5. Can active-duty dependents <u>living off</u> base attend the DoDEA school (Maxwell Elementary

and Middle School) on base?

Yes, active-duty members with orders to Maxwell AFB-Gunter Annex can apply for their children to attend the DoDEA school on base. Acceptance is based on eligibility and space available. For more information click here.

7. Pre-K Enrollment?

Alabama's nationally recognized First-Class Pre-K programs accept registration applications at the beginning of each calendar year (Jan/Feb). **To participate**, a child must be 4 years old (and not yet 5) on or before 1 September of the current school year. Go to Alabama First Class to learn more about First Class Pre-K programs.

Maxwell Elementary & Middle School (DoDEA) also offers a full day (beginning SY24/25) Pre-K program on base. **To participate, a child must be 4 years old (and not yet 5) on or before 1 September, of the current school year.** MEMS Pre-K will be a full day program beginning SY24/25. Families residing on installation are assured enrollment at MEMS Pre-K. Active-duty members assigned to Maxwell AFB – Gunter Annex <u>living off</u> the installation may also apply for the PreK program on a space available basis as part of the DoDEA Pilot program. 8. When is the magnet school application window?

The application window typically opens 1-31 January prior to the new school year. Please check the Montgomery Public Schools website for current information.

9. Do we have to be in Alabama to apply for magnet schools?

No, you do not have to live in Montgomery Public School District (MPS) to apply, although if your child is selected and chooses to attend, you will have to live in the MPS district – including Maxwell/Gunter – by the first day of school. This means that anyone can apply, regardless of where they currently live.

10. Where can I find school's accountability data (ranking, test scores, financial, demographics, etc.)?

The Alabama State Department Education (ALSDE) gives each school a grade each year. The grade is based on the school's test scores, attendance, and other factors. The school's report also includes financial (free and reduced lunch numbers) and other demographic information. 11. What are the boundaries for off-base schools?

12. What is the school registration procedure?

You will need the following documents to register your child (some districts now offer online registration where you upload your documents). Schools may have different guidelines, check your school's website:

- a. Child's birth certificate
- b. Child's Alabama Certificate of Immunization (can be obtained from Maxwell Immunization Clinic or the County Health Department)
- c. Proof of address (such as a current utility bill, mortgage, or lease agreement with your name and current address on it/some schools will need to verify your lease agreement at the district office) Check with your school regarding lease acceptance.
- d. Parent/Guardian photo ID
- e. Copy of your orders (required for MEMS or Out of District Enrollment)
- f. Unofficial Copy of School Records, Transcripts, IEP, 504, etc. (recommended)
- **This is what is typically required by public school districts in the area. However, we recommend that you check your school's website and talk to the registrar at your school for more information.

13. How far is the walk or bus ride to and from school on base?

The walk could be up to a mile. Maxwell Elementary & Middle School is located near base housing on Maxwell AFB. All families living on Maxwell AFB, to include the FAMCAMP, must provide their own way to school. Students living on Gunter Annex are bussed to Maxwell Elementary & Middle School. Bus service is also provided to students who live on base and attend *their zoned* Montgomery Public School.

14. What are the state procedures for home schooling?

Parents have a number of choices if they are interested in homeschooling.
